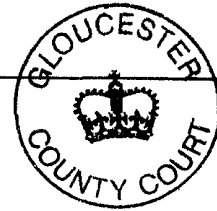

Order Residence and Contact Order
Section 8 Children Act 1989

UPON hearing from the solicitors for both parties

IT IS ORDERED THAT

1. There be a residence order in respect of the above named children in favour of the father.

2. The father do make the above named children available for contact with the mother as follows;
 - a) on alternate weekends either Saturday or Sunday (to be agreed 7 days before) from 9:00am until 5:00pm, the mother to collect and return the children, to commence on Saturday 11th November 2006,

 - b) when the mother secures suitable accommodation to allow both children to have staying contact, the father do make the children available for contact with the mother on alternate weekends 9:00am Saturday until 5:00pm Sunday, mother to collect and return,

 - c) there be alternate christmas and new year contact with the father having contact with the children christmas day 2006 and the mother having contact new years day 2007 and vice versa for next year and so on,

 - d) for school holiday contact with the mother when Holly starts school in September 2007 as follows;
 - i) two weeks in each summer holiday,
 - ii) half of all half terms,
 - iii) christmas/new year as agreed at paragraph (c) above and any such other contact over the christmas/new year period as may be agreed,

e) any such other contact as may be agreed between the parties on the basis that both parties have 7 days notice of additional contact,

f) the father be given at least 48 hours notice of any proposed changes in relation to agreed contact in accordance with this order,

g) if the mother cancels the arranged contact or is more than 3 hours late after an agreed collection time that the father reserves the right to assume that no contact will take place on that occasion and refuse contact for that occasion only, unless there is a legitimate reason for the lateness or cancellation in which case alternative contact shall be offered.

3. There shall be further or other contact as may be agreed between the father and mother.

4. The matter be listed for a review on the first open date after 25th April 2007, with a time estimate of 30 minutes, (the court to notify parties of the date).

5. Costs in the application.

Warning

Where a residence Order is in force no person may cause the children to be known by a new surname or remove the children from the United Kingdom without the written consent of every person with parental responsibility for the children or the leave of the court.

However, this does not prevent the removal of the children, for a period of less than 1 month, by the person in whose favour the Residence Order is made (Sections 13(1) and (2) Children Act 1989).

It may be a criminal offence under the Child Abduction Act 1984 to remove the children from the United Kingdom without the leave of the Court.

Notice

Any person with parental responsibility for the children may obtain advice on what can be done to prevent the issue of a passport to the children. They should write to
